The mission of the Fresno Irrigation District is to **PROTECT AND MANAGE** the surface and groundwater resources of the District in order to meet the present and future water needs of the people and lands within the District.

### FACTS

The Fresno Irrigation District was formed in 1920 under the California Irrigation Districts Act as the successor to the privately owned Fresno Canal and Land Company. The assets of the company consisted of over 800 miles of canals and distribution works which were constructed between 1850 and 1880 and the extensive water rights on the Kings River.

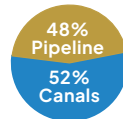

FID serves **3 Cities**: Fresno, Clovis and Kerman, and **4 communities**: Biola, Easton, Pinedale, and Malaga within Fresno County



**914,000 acre-feet** of total groundwater recharge has occurred within FID since 2005.



**980 acres** of FID-developed basins. **270 new acres** constructed since 2020



Average FID irrigation season:  
**5 Months** with **500,000 AF** delivered on an average annual basis
